

## Year 5 Homework Grid – Term 2 Anglo Saxons & Vikings.

Create a map of Britain showing the Anglo-Saxon kingdoms and how they changed when the Vikings invaded.



Select a famous figure from the Anglo Saxon or Viking era. Draw or paint or collage a picture of them. It could be a king, soldier, God or someone else.



Research what the Vikings thought about death. Where do they believe they go when they die? What rituals did they practice?

Research the Vikings and create a poster that contains at least 6 key facts about the Anglo-Saxon to Viking period in Britain. Think about any pictures that could be included.



Create your own Sutton Hoo helmet/mask using whatever materials you have. You could also decorate it using tin foil or buttons. Look at the one found at Sutton Hoo for an example. (It can be any size)
