<u>Homework/Extension</u> Using Prepositions to Express Place

Developing

- 1. False, because 'flew' is a verb in the past tense. 'Over' is the only other preposition that expresses place in this sentence.
- 2. A and C
- 3. Various answers, for example: The preposition of place 'from' would make sense as it is followed by a noun (kitchen window). The sentence could read: We saw the fire being put out <u>from</u> our kitchen window.

Expected

- 4. A. True: B. True
- 5. A, B and D
- 6. Various answers, for example: The preposition of place 'between' would make sense as it is followed by a plural noun (trees). The sentence could read: I've heard that an angry bear may be hiding <u>between</u> the trees.

Greater Depth

7. False, because only sentence B begins with a preposition that expresses place. 'Upon' is a preposition that expresses place in sentence A. The preposition 'throughout' has been used to express place in sentence B and time in sentence C.

9. Various answers, for example: The prepositions of place 'around' and 'near' would make sense in this sentence because both are followed by nouns that fit the context (corner; hotel). The sentence could read: <u>Around</u> the corner, the photographer spotted a celebrity near the famous hotel.
